



#### March 2024 Thompson Legislative Update:

- Congressman Thompson secured \$16.3 million for projects in California's 4<sup>th</sup> District with the Consolidated Appropriations Act. The funding includes funding for projects in Lake, Napa, Solano, Sonoma, and Yolo Counties.
  - Lake County:
    - \$4.116 million for the Clearlake Burns Valley Sports Complex
    - \$959,752 for the In-Lake Water Treatment System at Clear Lake
    - \$500,000 for the Big Valley Fish Habitat Improvement and Groundwater Recharge Project
  - Napa County:
    - \$959,752 for the Water Treatment Plant Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition System/Microgrid in St. Helena
    - \$800,000 for the Napa River Ecology Center
    - \$1,383,069 for the Lake Hennessey & Deer Park Fuel Reduction and Community Infrastructure Protection project.
  - Solano County:
    - \$959,752 for the Rio Vista Wastewater Plant Consolidation and Reclaimed Water Project
    - \$850,000 for the Vacaville Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club
    - \$500,000 for the Dixon Police Department 2<sup>nd</sup> Story Expansion
  - Sonoma County:
    - \$1,116,279 for the Highway 37 Tolay Creek Bridge Replacement and Restoration Project
    - \$1,000,000 for the Highway 116/West Cotati Intersection Safety Improvement Project
    - \$898,000 for the Santa Rosa Community Violence Reduction Project
    - Yolo County
      - \$1,050,000 for the I-5/SR 113 Connectors as part of the East Main Street Neighborhood Livability Project in Woodland
      - \$850,000 for the South Davis Library and Community Center Project
      - \$432,291 for a Fire Truck for the Clarksburg Fire Protection District
- Congressman Thompson welcomed Liz Burrell Russell, the former manager of The Pathway Home in Yountville, as his guest to the State of the Union to help amplify the importance of addressing gun violence. Ahead of the State of the Union, Congressman Thompson was selected by Democratic Leader Hakeem Jeffries to serve as a designated survivor.
- Congressman Thompson, Senator Alex Padilla, Congressman Ken Calvert, and Congressman Doug LaMalfa sent a letter urging the agriculture committees to include

permanent disaster assistance for agricultural producers and communities in the upcoming Farm Bill.

- As Chair of the Gun Violence Prevention Task Force, led 138 members of Congress in calling on Veterans Affairs Secretary Denis McDonough to protect veterans and address some of the problems caused by the Kennedy Amendment. The Kennedy Amendment rolls back 30 years of precedent and makes it easier for veterans who are mentally incompetent to access firearms.
- Every year, Rep. Thompson selects inspiring women from California's Fourth District to
  recognize their outstanding work and effort to make our community a better place over the last
  year. As part of Women's History Month, Rep. Mike Thompson recognized the below honorees:

  - Karen Collins Sonoma County
  - Karen Urbano Yolo County
- Rep. Mike Thompson (CA-04) and Rep. Mike Levin (CA-49) led a letter calling on the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to avoid imposing charges that will raise constituents' utility bills, and make it substantially more difficult for families to realize cost savings from electrifying their homes, improving their energy efficiency, or installing distributed energy resources such as rooftop solar.
- Rep. Mike Thompson (CA-04) and Democratic Woman's Caucus Chair Rep. Lois Frankel (FL-22) introduced resolution to support the goals and ideals of National Women's History Month. Thompson introduces this resolution each year to mark March as Women's History Month and celebrate the diverse history of our country's women. The theme of National Women's History Month 2024 is "Women Who Advocate for Equity, Diversity and Inclusion."
